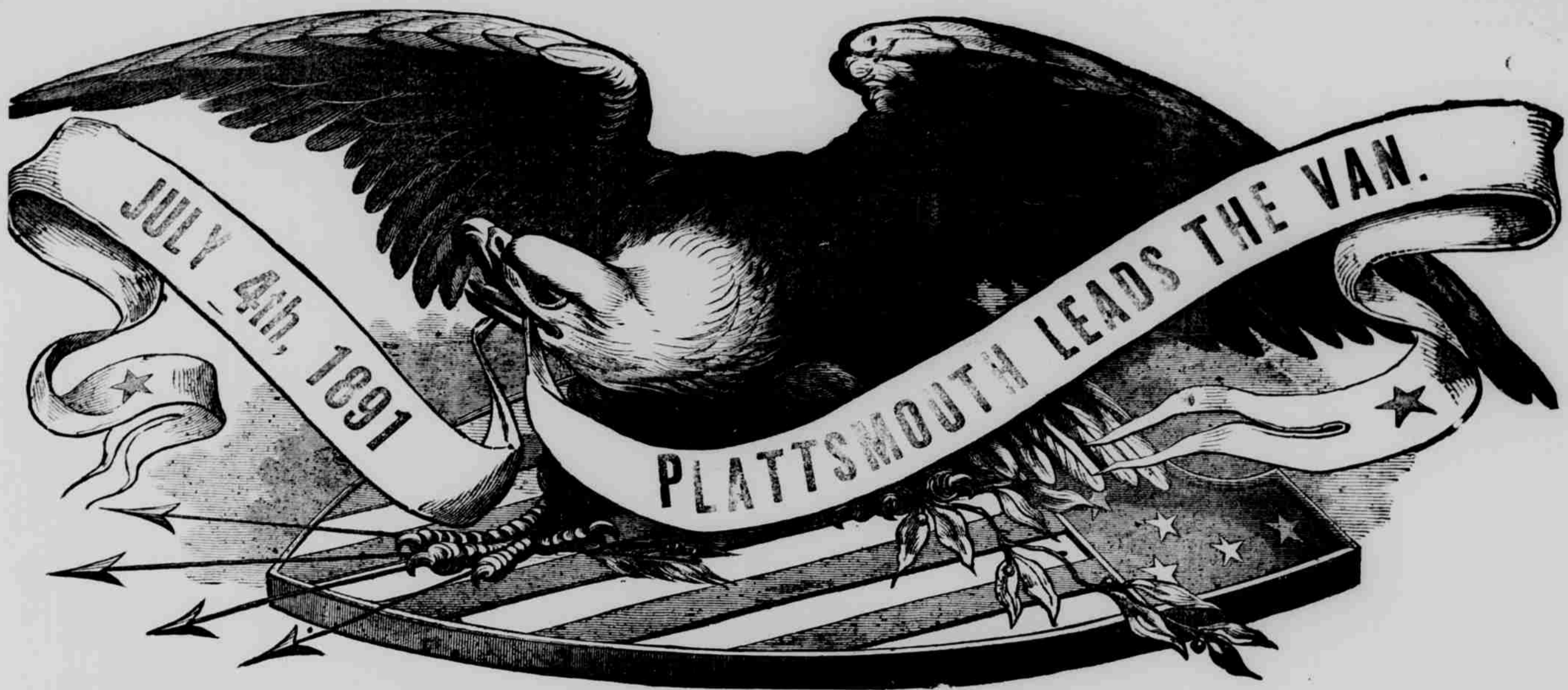


# PLATTSMOUTH LEADS THE VAN.
