**REPUBLICAN CONVENTION**

The republican electors of the state of Nebraska are requested to send delegates from their several counties to meet in convention in the city of Lincoln, Thursday, September 24, 1891, at 10 o'clock a. m., for the purpose of placing in nomination candidates for one associate justice of the supreme court, and two members of the board of regents of the state university, and to transact such other business as may be presented to the convention.

**THE APPOINTMENT**

The several counties are entitled to representation as follows, being based upon the vote cast for Hon. Geo. H. Hastings, for attorney-general in 1880, giving one delegate at large to each county, and one for each 150 votes and the major fraction thereof.

**GOOD GERMAN AUTHORITY**

In a recent letter from Hermann Raster, printed in the Staats-Zeitung, he has something to say about the people in the vicinity of the little bathing place in Germany where he is staying. They are weavers by trade, and under average circumstances each of them earns about 40 cents a day on which to support himself, wife, and what children he may have. The democratic free-trade orator will say at once that everything is much cheaper abroad than here and that the 40 cents are the equivalent of a great many more in American money.

This is Mr. Raster's statement of what the weaver buys with his wages daily for himself, wife and four children: Rent of the single room they occupy, which contains the loom, cooking utensils and bed, is 12x15 feet, 24 cents per day; a five-pound loaf of bread, made of rye and barley, 32 cents; a quart and a half of skimmed milk, 12 cents; half a peck of potatoes, 36 cents; a quarter of a peck of flour, 42 cents; salt, 08 cent; kerosene, 1 cent; butter, 12 cents; total, 276 cents. This does not leave much leeway for meat and coal or clothes.

The weaver buys every two or three weeks half a pound of meat with bones, and pays about 7 cents for it. In winter he buys a hundredweight of coal, for which he pays 26 cents and which lasts him ten days.

The American workingman is in the habit of living somewhat better than this, and would not care to drop down to this frugal fare. But he will have to if his democratic friends force him to enter into competition with men who live as these German weavers do. Is he quite

ready to take all duties off competitive goods, and to go into a manufacturing war, to be victor in which he must imitate the style of living of his opponent?

The Greenwood Gazette has died again. As this is about the fifth time it has died, we begin to think an obituary notice is justly deserved.

Life HALFORD has been a good private secretary, and he may have a chance to make some money for himself in '92, but he can hardly expect to amass any such sum as Dan Lambert has put into the bank since '89. — Courier Journal.

He is now at Portland, Oregon, but he promises to come back and make a clean breast of the whole affair, which he intimates may send some people to the penitentiary who are now flying very high. By all means, Mr. Taylor, come back and tell us what you know of the only sin on pure alliance legislature we ever had in Nebraska. Your experience might be of value to future legislatures.

COTTONWOOD Alliance is a fair sample of the unanimous desire of the political farmers to serve their beloved country — on a salary. This is the way they stand at Cottonwood: J. M. Kiser and Walter Propst are groomed for sheriff, Coon Valley and Josh Murray each have their advocates for county commissioner. Ross Morrow would like a glimpse at the promised land, while Samuel Richardson is being industriously backed by his friends for county treasurer. Each one of the above candidates is a member of Cottonwood Alliance, and each candidate has a following, so that the order is all broken up into factions. We are told that other alliances in the county are in the same plight with Cottonwood. The lesson to be derived from this is, that if republicans STAND TOGETHER and nominate a ticket composed of good men, the free and fair choice of the party, the republican ticket will be elected from top to bottom.
