FEEDING A DELICATE BABY.

There are three points to be considered in feeding a delicate baby, writes Elizabeth Robinson Scovil in \$1 50 the April Ladies' Home Journal.

- The kind of food. The quantity given at once.
- The time between the meals.

The kind of food must, of course, 50 depend upon the child; what agrees 15 with one cannot be taken by another, while it exactly suits a third. A good receipt is one tablespoonful of milk, two tablesoonfuls of cream, two tablespoonfuls of lime-water, and three of boiled water, sweetened with a tiny pinch of milk sugar. Make it milk warm, and the food is ready for use. This is sufficient for one feeding for an ordinary sized baby until it is two months old; after that gradually increase the quantity without changing the proportion of the ingredients.


