Germany's New Twin Guns.

some experiments conducted at Meppen, with a new twin gun against armor plates. The idea is that by firing the guns simultaneously at one object, the crushing force of the two projectiles will be such that the stoutest armor must give way before such a shock. In order that this may really happen, it is obviously necessary that, in the first place, the explosion in each gun should be effected at the same fraction of a second, that the charges should be exactly equal and barn exactly the same time, that the shots should be of exactly the same weight and that they should feach the object aimed at simultaneously, Such accuracy is extremely difficult to compass, and it is believed that very-con-fore the object in view can be realized. -Vanity Fair.






