The vote of twenty-one precincts throughout the state shows a gain that is estimated would give Crouse a gain of 1,740 over Richards' vote in 1890...

Twenty-five voting precincts give Crouse 3,224, Van Wyck 1,522, Morton 1,625. A number of precincts in the city of Lincoln are included.

Forty-two voting precincts throughout the state give Harrison 6,257, Morton 1,625, Weaver 3,907.

Sixty-seven voting precincts in Nebraska give the following vote on president: Harrison, 10,770; Cleveland, 2,740; Weaver, 6,632.

Forty-four voting precincts give for governor: Crouse, 5,661; Morton, 2,372; Van Wyck, 2,842.

Thus far the returns show a falling off of the democratic and independent vote of two years ago on the state ticket and indicate the election of the entire republican state ticket as well as the electoral ticket.
