Republican State Convention.
The republican state convention has been called to meet at Lincoln on the 26th day of August. This is rather early, but the date was placed early in order that, according to the new election law, the emblem most suitable for use on the ticket could be chosen. The eagle is the republican emblem in most states where the blanket ticket is used, while the rooster does duty as a democratic emblem. The convention which first meets has choice of emblems and the state central committee did not want the "demmys" to steal our eagle. The apportionment is based on the vote cast for McKinley, and will make a convention of 925 delegates. This will give Cass county as many, if not more, delegates than last year.
