THE "DADS" TRANSACT BUSINESS

Each Member Brings Before the Council Business of Consideration.

The council met in regular session last evening with Mayor Gutsche in the chair, the only absentee being Heisel.

The minutes of the last session were read and approved, after which a communication from Wm. Wettenkamp was read in regard to the council chamber and police headquarters, in which among other things, he offered to provide a room for storing wood. It was referred to the judiciary committee.

The treasurer's report was read, showing a balance on hand of \$8,791.07. Referred to the finance committee.

The report of the police judge and chief of police was read and referred to the police committee.

The claims committee reported the claim of H. C. McMaken & Son as correct, and it was reported to the finance committee.

Slater, of the F. H. H. stated that O'Neil had considerable tax which he desired to work out, and would do the filling in of the road out near the brick yard south of town, for 8 cents a yard. On motion, he was granted permission to do the work.

Sattler said that an opportunity offered to trade the old street car rails for a couple of carloads of stone chips, and he was instructed to make the trade.

Lutz, of the fire and water committee reported that the catch basins had been raised as directed.

Whalen of the light committee reported that a couple of persons wished to take gas, but that some 600 feet of mains would have to be laid in order to accommodate them. No action was taken in the matter.

Sattler called attention to an alley on Wintersteen hill, which he said was in bad condition. On motion the street commissioner was ordered to make the necessary repairs immediately. A culvert and ditch near the Pacific house were also ordered repaired.

Wurtemberger asked that some grading be done in order that he could lay some sidewalk, which was ordered done. Several washouts were ordered repaired and a number of sidewalks were ordered put down and the costs taxed up against the owners of the property.

City Attorney Grimes read a lengthy statement in regard to the cases of Dovey vs. the city and the B. & M. vs. the city, and Cummings moved that the council consent to a continuance in the case of the B. & M. against the city. Carried.

The names of J. L. Root, Henry Herold and Mrs. Thomas Walling were submitted to fill vacancies on the library board, and were promptly confirmed.

On motion of Lutz, an alley on Cutt-off street was ordered opened, and on motion of Whiten crossing at Seventh and Locust was ordered repaired.

Rebal asked that the chief of police be instructed to put in a small culvert at Oak and Vine, and also one at Thirteenth and Vine. The work was ordered done.

Sattler called attention to a pile of old lumber owned by the city, and on motion of Cummings all old lumber owned by the city that was not suitable for repairing sidewalk, was ordered hauled to the electric light works to be used as fuel.

The finance committee reported the following bills as correct, and they were allowed, after which the council adjourned.

PROTESTS ARE FILED.

The Silver Republicans Force to Be Tested.

Yesterday George L. Sheldon, by his attorneys, Beeson & Root, C. S. Polk and C. A. Rawls, filed a protest with the county clerk against allowing the silver republican ticket to go on the ballot according to the new election law.

protest was filed by J. W. Holmes against W. C. Nye's name appearing on the ticket for assessor of Rock Bluffs precinct as a silver republican, and one by C. W. Taylor against Jacob Falter appearing on the ticket in the same way for the reason that it was intended to mislead the voter, and because there was no such party at the last election and according to the new law, no such ticket could be printed. The matter comes up for hearing before Robertson on Friday. The claim that a convention of fifty silver republicans nominated a ticket is denied as no such number rightly belonging to that faith can be found in the county.

Wants \$25,000 Damages.

He alleges in his petition that on the 14th day of August, 1896, he was directed with certain others to carry some lumber from a lumber pile across the track and into the building where he was working. That while so doing he was struck and knocked down, badly bruised and a leg cut off by a locomotive that failed to make its approach known by either whistling or ringing of bell.

The wounds, bruises, and loss of limb mentioned above, he considers worth \$25,000, and accordingly sues for that amount.
