Washington, D. C., July 28. - Secretary Day and the president conferred again today over the rough draft of the answer to Spain, which will be submitted to the cabinet at its meet- day house during the day.

It is stated positively by a member of the cabinet that the section relating to the Philippines has not yet been agreed upon.

There is to be no armistice until a witness. Spain has agreed generally to the peace terms of the United States.

The president will not consent to a joint protectorate of any kind over the Philippines.

He will demand that no portion of the Spanish bonds, aggregating \$600,-000,000, be fastened on Cuba.


