THAT the beef trust is not getting the whole thing is shown by the statement appearing in Bradstreet's last week, that "three-year-old Texas shorthorn cattle sold for \$6.75 at the Chicago stockyards Monday, which is the highest price paid for Texas cattle since 1882."

Politics, indeed, makes strange bedfellows. Here is Fred DuBois, the Idaho silver statesman, arguing that the few gold standard New Englanders who are now "flocking by themselves" under the title of anti-expansionists, may co-operate with the silver republicans, simply because they have nowhere else to go.

THE silver republicans who rec ntly met at Chicago and resolved to renew the fight in favor of the white metal in 1900 had evidently not heard from President Warner of the Bimetallic Learge who, in his recent visit to Washington, admitted that the wonderful developments of gold production of late have caused a depreciation of that metal, thus making it apparent that the arguments in favor of silver can no longer be maintained.
