RATIGAN IS MUCH WANTED.

Iwo States That Need Him in Their Bust-

Springfield, Ills., June 16.-Edward Ratigan, who escaped from Waupun prison some months ago, has been captured and is being held here. He was arrested on a charge of robbing a postoffice and is on trial in the United States district court here. Warden C. C. McClaughrey, of the Wisconsin state penitentirary, arrived in Springfield Thursday, and is waiting to take possession of Ratigan in case he is acquitted. Ratigan is held here under the name of John Evans.

Ratigan was sent to Waupun for robbing the Amherst bank. The postal authorities claim that he has robbed several postoffices in this state and elsewhere. After serving some time in prison he managed to make his escape and was at large until his arrest by a postoffice inspector in this city. There is a very strong case against him here Neither Hanna nor those who are close and it is probable that he will be convicted, in which case Warden Mc-Claughrey will not get his man.


