It was telegraphed by Secretary Hay to the president, who responded with a wholesome expression of gratification and word of it was sent to the various cabinet officers. They gathered in Secretary Hay's office, and an impromptu cabinet conference was held

in the diplomatic chamber mainly for the purpose of exchanging congratulations and of taking a survey of the sitnation to see if it had been materially changed by this important development. The government accepted the message as authentic, and Secretary Hay transmitted it to all our ambassadors and ministers abroad, with instructions to lay it before the respective governments to which they are accredited and to urge upon them the necessity of co-operation for the immediate relief of the foreigners at Peking. Urgent Need of an Advance,

A message was also sent by Secretary Long to Admiral Remey, conveying the intelligence of the desperate situation in Peking and instructing him to "use and urge every possible endeavor for relief." This message Secretary Long explained meant for Admiral Remey to himself "use" and to "urge" upon the commanding officers of the other powers the use of every endeavor for the relief of Peking. Secretary Root sent a similar notification to Colonel Coolidge, the senior American officer ashore at Tien-Tsin.

British Counsellor to the Chinese Legation at London So Declares.

London, July 21 .- Sir Halliday Macartney, counsellor and English secretary to the Chinese legation in London, who was interviewed yesterday, admitted that the legation was in recelpt of news which it was not able to disclose. He added: "You may take it that on July 18, the date of the coln .- Louisville Courier. Conger message, all the legations and Europeans in Peking were safe.

"I cannot say why the other ministers are not able to communicate with their governments, but there is no reason why they should not use the same channel as Mr. Conger employed. Perhaps a supreme effort was made for Mr. Conger's message, and possibly the Chinese do not realize the anxiety existing in Europe."

[Note.-The Conger message had no date. That referred to by Sir Halliday was the date given by the governor of Shan-Tung as the date on which Conger's message was forwarded from Peking, the said message has been received by the governor yesterday.]


