#### German History.

[Communicated. In a former communication I mentioned the city of Munster, Provience Westphalia, Germany. In this country originated the celebrated Westphalia ham. Munster is one of the oldest cities in Germany, and has a history. At the time of the reformation, Westphalia did not belong to the King-

dom of Prussia, but was ruled by a Bishop of the Catholic church, the country being largely Catholic. After the reformation defferent religious sects sprung into existence. Among them a fanatical sect who called themselves Rebaptisers, (Wiedertaufer) or Anabaptist, believing, as they did, that the baptism of infants was no

baptism at all. The history of the Anabaptist movement in its outward development is brief, but eventful. In 1521, their first rising took place at Zwikau, under the leadership of Thomas Muncer. Compelled to leave, he visited Bohemia. In 1524, he spent some time in Switzer-By a determined attempt a theocracy was made at the city of Munster, in Westphalia, in 1532 and 1535. Here the sect had gained considerable in fluence through the adhesion of Roth man, a citizen of Munster and a minister. Here they had gained considerable influence, and the leaders, Johann Matthieson, a baker of Harlem, and Johann Bockhold, a tailor of Leyden, had little difficulty in obtaining pos session of the city and deposing the magistrates. Vigorous preparations were at once made, not only to hold what had been gained, but to proceed from Munster as a centre to the conquest of the world. They held full sway of the city of Munster for several years, and done as they pleased. It is told that the leader, Johann Bockhold. had many wives, and in open 'court, where he claimed to be the head judge, took an ax and chopped off the head of They forced people to accept their religion.
