Ordinance No.

AN ORDINANCE, regulating the making of excavations in and upon the streets, alleys and public grounds of the city of Plattsmouth for all purposes save and except for drain layers, and the laying, relaying and repairing of sewer pipes, and providing penalties for the violations of the provisions

Be it enacted by the Mayor and Council of the City of Plattsmouth:

SECTION 1. That it be and hereby is de-clared unlawful for any person or persons to excavate the earth in and upon any street and alley or public ground in the city of Platts-mouth, except for drain layers, and the lay-ing, relaying and repairing of sewer pipes, save and except as follows:

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance be and the same hereby are repealed.


