## DEATH OF AN OLD CITIZEN

## William M. Houseworth Dies From The Effects of a Stroke of Paralysis.

William M. Houseworth an aged and most highly respected citizen died Tuesday morning, May 16, 1905. Last Saturday morning he received a stroke of paralysis, from the effects of which he never regained consciousness. On Saturday morning he was apparently in his usual health, and at the noon hour had partaken of a very hearty meal. In fact he was seen upon the streets in the earlier part of the day, and his death was a great and sudden shock to his relatives and those who knew him well.

The funeral services were held at the family residence at 4 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, Canon H. B. Burgess, assisted by Rev. J T Baird officiating. The remains were taken to Lincoln yesterday, where they were buried with Masonic honors. The Masonic lodge of this city, of which the deceased was a member, turned out in a body to attend the remains to the Burlington station. In reference to the deceased, the Lincoln Journal of yesterday says:

"William Mc. D. Houseworth formerly a resident of Lincoln, died at Plattsmouth at 4 o'clock yesterday morning of paralysis, aged seventyfour years. He was stricken Saturday afternoon at one o'clock and remained unconscious until the end. The body will arrive in Lincoln today and the funeral will be direct from the Burlington depot to Wyuka cemetery and will be under the auspices of the Masonic fraternity of which order he had been a member for over fifty years.

"Street cars will be furnished at the Burlington depot for all friends who desire to attend. Kindly omit flowers.

"Mr. Houseworth was born on a farm near Chillicothe, O., July 11, 1831, where his boyhood days were spent.
