

MOVEMENT LAUDABLE

Wherein the Promoter Seeks to Check the Mail Order Business.

A novel idea and a determined man behind it are to be combined into a movement to check the great growth of the mail order business which has been growing in Nebraska at the expense of the country towns and country stores. The man is Mr. F. H. Burdick, of Tobias, Neb. He is the editor of the Express, but he has now established a paper to which he gives the unique title "The Amol Banner," meaning the Anti-Mail Order league.

Briefly stated, says the World-Herald, Mr. Burdick's system, which he has copyrighted, provides for an ingenious business co-operation between local newspapers and country mer-

Under this system, the country merchant is not to pay for his advertising except in proportion to the results which he derives. Under the advertisement of the country merchant in A Large Number of Invited Guests Present the local paper is displayed a trade order on the merchant for \$1, good for that amount in the purchase of \$16 worth of merchandise. For every one of these orders brought to the mercountry editor 25 cents.
