An Interesting Land Case in Boyd County Just Decided.

Land Commissioner Eaton has received information from the department of the interior, says the Lincoln News, that the contention of the state as to a quarter-section of land occupied by G. W. McCright in Boyd county has been sustained and that, thereby, the state has gained the last point in the controversy over the school lands which have been in question for three years. 
