# MUST ENFORCE THE LAW

State Superintendent Says it is Up to the County Superintendents.

Advises Them to Look After the Matter Rigidly and Keep a Truant Record.

County superintendents must enforce the compulsory education law. So State Superintendent McBrien writes in answer to the many inquiries he has received on the subject. and boards of education to report any violations of the law to the county superintendent. He must investigate and give written notice to the violators. The further duty of the county superintendent is expressed in the state superintendent's letter as fol-

"And if one week from the time of said notice such parties are still living in violation of the law, then the county superintendent shall appear in the court of the county judge and file his complaint against such parties violating the law.
