Koubek, fire last Wednesday evening was the big-in a great white snow desert which cloaks the country from the Missouri to the Rockies. It is stated that cattle on the ranges have fared badly and great loss is feared. There are also reports of some loss of life in the blizzard but these are largely suppositions and do not bear the stamp of reliability.

One curious incident in the bad weather is that the special train of Samuel Newhouse running from Chicago to New York yesterday made the run in 830 minutes, the distance being 842 miles. The regular trains on which he traveled from Salt Lake to Chicago were several hours late and as he wanted to catch the steamer Lusitania at New York, he feared to trust to the regular trains and hired a special which frisked him to his destination in plenty of time. This is a remarkable feat when the weather is considered. The record for fast time between New York and Chicago was destroyed, it being reduced from eighteen hours to seventeen hours and forty-six minutes.
