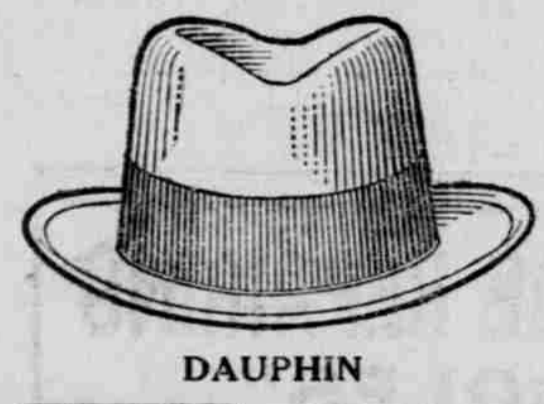
Asks for Estate's Settlement.

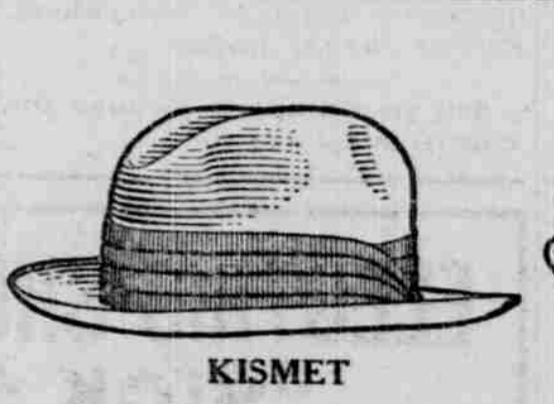

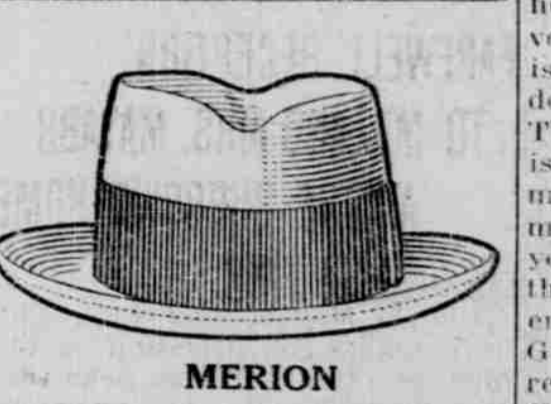

A few facts in regard to the man who jumped off of No. 73, the fast freight, here last Saturday afternoon, has just leaked out, and the following from the Glenwood Tribune will shed a little light on the matter and shows that the man was not a hobo, as was supposed, but was merely trying to ride from Pacific Junction to this city and picked out the wrong train to make the trip on:

Otto Abel of Glenwood, son of Charles Abel, having word from a friend in Plattsburgh of a chance to secure work, decided to go over there last Saturday. Otto went to Pacific Junction and caught a freight train to Plattsburgh, which did not stop there. He jumped from the moving train and received some severe bruises about the face, and was rendered unconscious for a time.

After being found, he was taken to Dr. Martin's office and after a dressing of his wounds was taken by the police and put in jail and there kept until Sunday morning.

The officials took from him his pocketbook and contents. Otto protested against being put in jail and having his money taken, telling who he was, and asked them to call his father at Glenwood, also his friend, Mr. Wright, in Plattsburgh.

Otto came home Sunday and is now under the care of Dr. Plimpton. Those who know Otto will be surprised to learn that he was charged with being a hobo and a drunk.

Value of Grapes.

Grapes should be very generally grown and better cared for says Secretary J. R. Duncan of the state horticultural society. The vines should be trimmed long enough before the sap begins to flow to allow the cuts to heal so that bleeding may be prevented. The season for pruning is already near to close. All dead wood should be removed. The prevailing mode of pruning is the renewal system. By this method one or two of the older main canes are removed each year, allowing new canes to take their place, thus renewing the entire vine every three years. Grapes are produced on the current season's growth, coming from buds on the canes produced the previous year. Each bud will produce from one to three bunches. The vine should not be allowed to produce more than 50 or 60 bunches.

Herbert Thacker gave a short account of the life of John Hancock, the president of the continental congress at the time of the Declaration of Independence was drafted, and Miss Ruby Winscott gave a very pleasing recitation of the immortal Gettysburg address of Abraham Lincoln. During the evening there were a number of most enjoyable musical numbers furnished by the talented members of the company, that were very much appreciated, and chief among these was the piano duet between Misses Una and Ina Crook, which was one of the finest on the program.
