THE PASSING OF MRS. HATTIE R. ALLISON

Born September 11, 1847, at North Baltimore, Ohio. Died at 6 o'clock Thursday morning, February 19, 1914, at their home, six miles northeast of Union, Neb., aged 66 years, 5 months and 8 days.

The sudden and unexpected death of this estimable lady cast a gloom over the entire community in which she lived, and few knew that she had been very seriously ill. A short time before her death she had enjoyed her usual good health, and her death, coming so suddenly, was a great shock to the relatives and friends. She was called upon to mourn the death of her mother, the late Mrs. Gertrude M. Wiley, and it was while attending the funeral on February 10, that Mrs. Allison took a severe cold that later developed into pneumonia and finally resulted in her death at the time above mentioned. The funeral services were held in the Lewiston church last Friday at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, attended by a very large number of friends and relatives, the services being conducted by Rev. W. A. Taylor of this place, who preached a very impressive sermon from Revelations 14-13. Interment was made in the cemetery adjoining the church, the pall bearers being Fred Clark, L. J. Ball, Frank Rhoden, John Chappeil, Creed Harris and John Hobschied.

The maiden name of the deceased was Hattie R. Wiley, and she was a daughter of Dr. William W. Wiley, who died many years ago, and Mrs. Gertrude M. Wiley, whose death occurred February 8th of this year. She was first married September 11, 1869, to Bernard Drost, and his death occurred September 3, 1887. To this union seven children were born, five of whom died in infancy, the surviving children being Mrs. Wilhelmina Tigner and Mrs. Jessie Leach. Her second marriage was September 30, 1889, to Leroy Allison, who, with the two daughters above named, are left to mourn her death. She came with her parents to this state and located in Omaha in 1857, and two years later they came to this county and located on the homestead where the parents resided until death called them away. The deceased was one of the very useful members of society, having an excellent education in addition to her ambition to do good to others and make the world better by having lived in it. She was a member of the Episcopal church, always active in the affairs of the religious organizations, and her influence for good will be sadly missed among the people with whom she associated so many years.



NEW ARRANGEMENT FOR BURLINGTON TRAIN NO. 1 IS NOW IN EFFECT

From Tuesday's Daily.

The order for the stopping of the fast Burlington train No. 1 from Chicago to Denver, which passes through this city about 6 o'clock in the morning, to allow passengers from Chicago and points east of the Mississippi river to get off here, has been sent out to the station agent here, Mr. R. W. Clement, and is effective, starting yesterday. While this modification of the running time was not all that was desired by the residents of this city, still it will prove a much more pleasing arrangement than formerly and one that will be much appreciated by the traveling men running out of Chicago, who by this means can make Plattsouth their first stop in Nebraska, instead of having to run on into Omaha and then come down here on a later train at a loss of time and money to themselves. The Burlington management found it very difficult even in making this concession, as this train is one that is run in competition with the trains on other roads and the best time possible has to be made on its running schedule, which is cut down to the smallest possible margin.

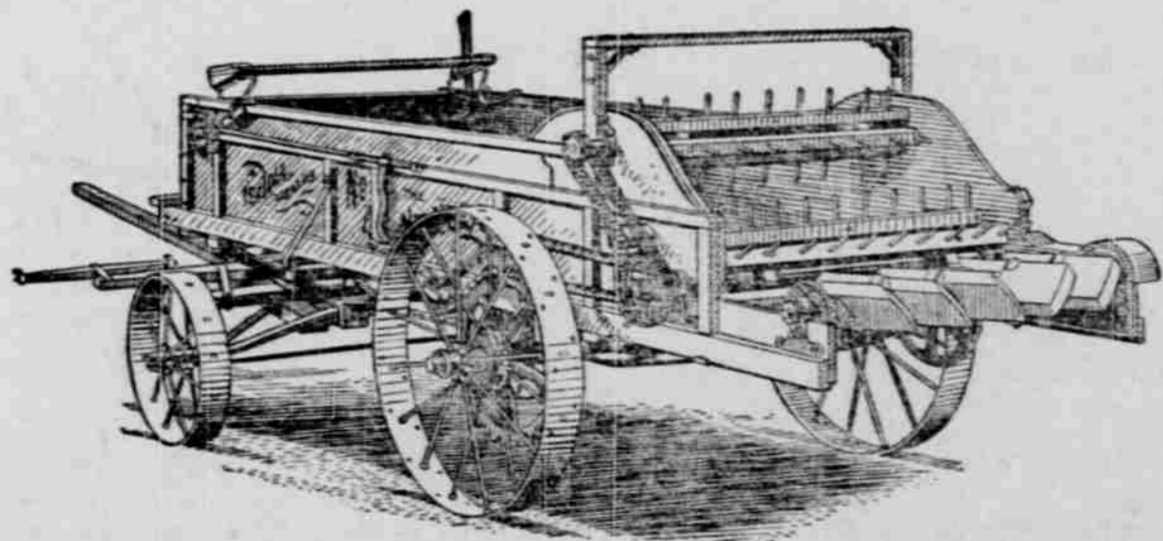
NEBR. CONSTRUCTION COMPANY LOSES OUT ON THEIR CONTRACT
