

COMMISSIONER'S PROCEEDINGS

Plattsmouth, March 3, 1914.

Board met pursuant to adjournment. Present, C. E. Heebner, Julius A. Pitz and C. R. Jordan, County Commissioners, and Frank J. Libershal, County Clerk.

Petition for the incorporation of the Village of Nehawka, Cass county, Nebraska, also a remonstrance against Village being incorporated, were read and placed on file.

As advertised for building bridges for the year 1914 bids were received from the following companies, and Board proceeded to open same:

Contract was this day entered into by and between the Board of County Commissioners and J. H. Tams, as Superintendent of the County Poor Farm, for the period of one year from March 1, 1914, to March 1, 1915.

J. H. Tams, Superintendent of Poor Farm, filed his report for year March 1, 1913, to March 1, 1914, as follows:

County Assessor W. R. Bryan requested the Board for an allowance of \$200 for clerk hire in his office for the year 1914. Same was allowed by the Board.
