He was a caller at the Journal office this morning and does not exhibit any signs of the dread disease and feels that his friends have been unduly agitated over the false report.

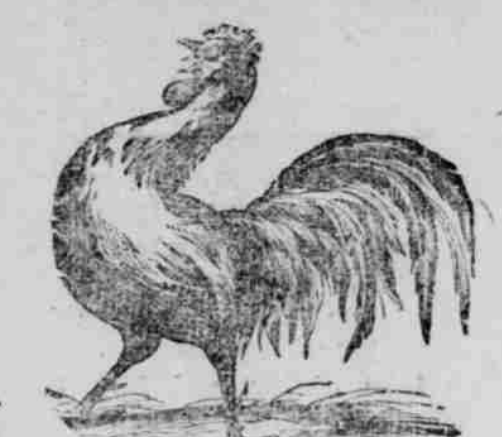
