## FUNERAL OF MRS. J. HICKSON OF SOUTH OMAHA HERE TODAY

This morning the body of Mrs. T. J. Hickson, a former resident of this city, was brought here from her late home at South Omaha and the interment made in Oak Hill cemetery, west of this city. Mrs. Hickson died Tuesday at South Omaha, where she had been making her home for some time past, after a short illness, and the funeral services were held there yesterday afternoon. A number of the relatives, including Mr. and Mrs. C. E. Snell of South Omaha, Fred Krayball and wife, Mrs. Lena Terry, Mrs. Caroline Botts and Mr. and Mrs. John Botts of Maysville, Missouri, accompanied the body here to attend the last sad rites.

Mrs. Hickson was 59 years of age and was married to Mr. T. J. Hickson at St. Joseph, Missouri, thirty-seven years ago, and the family later moved to this city, where they resided for a number of years, and afterwards removed to Havelock, where they resided up to a few years ago. Mr. Hickson died at Havelock some four years ago, and since then the widow has made her home at South Omaha for the greater part of the time. The death of this estimable lady was much regretted by the many old friends and they shared with the bereaved family the grief of her passing.
