Lincoln, Oct. 20.—A committee of seven leading democrats of the state have been appointed by J. M. Tanner, president, and E. A. Walrath, secretary of the Democratic State Press association, to meet in the Lindell hotel here next Wednesday afternoon to make plans for a big democratic state dinner in Lincoln in March, to open the campaign for the presidential year. The committee consists of J. W. Cutright, C. W. Bryan, G. S. Foxworthy and Frank D. Eager of Lincoln; W. M. Maupin of Omaha, W. F. Cramb of Fairbury and Edgar Howard of Columbus. Speakers of prominence will be secured for the dinner in March, which 1,000 democrats are expected to attend.

### BULGARS ARE VERY FEARFUL OF RUMANIA

Paris, Oct. 20.—The Saloniki correspondent of the Havas News agency sends the following dispatch under Tuesday's date:  
"French troops, having received orders not to pass the Bulgarian frontier, Strumitsa has not been occupied by the allies.  
"The Bulgarians are concentrating troops in haste in Dobrudja, supposedly because Rumania appeared to be leaning more towards the entente. At the same time three divisions of Bulgarian troops are being concentrated on the Greek frontier. Communications by the Uskub railway now are said to be definitely assured for the allied troops.  
"The entire Bulgarian coast on the Aegean sea has been evacuated by the civilian population and the authorities."

### SUFFOCATION KILLS YOUNG COUPLE IN OMAHA

George Shirley and Wife Dead in Bed Since Monday Night, When Last Seen.

### YOUNG PEOPLE MARRIED A YEAR

Omaha, Neb., Oct. 21.—E. George Shirley, aged 27 years, and his young wife, Edith, aged 24 years, were found dead in bed, as the result of suffocation, Wednesday afternoon in their home, 3558 Dodge street.

Robert Shirley, a brother, receiving no response at the door, pried open a window in their bedroom and discovered the lifeless bodies. Since Monday evening relatives and friends had repeatedly called the house by phone, but to no avail. Yesterday afternoon officers of the Omaha Crockery company, where Shirley was employed, notified relatives of Shirley's absence.

According to Coroner Crosby, the gas heater under the water tank in the basement, was left burning, and all of the oxygen in the house was burned up. Suffocation was the result. Death, which was apparently accidental, evidently occurred some time between Monday night and Wednesday noon. According to police officers the house was so filled with fumes that it was with difficulty they managed to throw open the windows and doors to air the place. Shirley was last seen Monday night, when he rode home with H. C. Forester, treasurer of the Omaha Crockery company.


