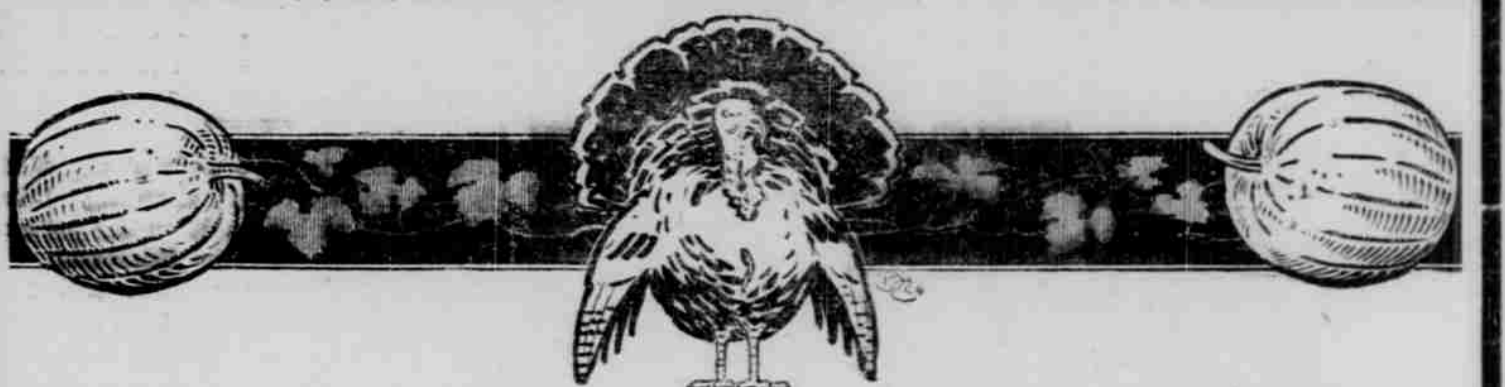
Mrs. M. Peterson has given up housekeeping and for the present will make her home with Mr. and Mrs. W. F. Diers.
