London, March 1.-The Anglo-French answer to the protest of the United States regarding the seizure of mails in transit between America and Europe will be delivered in the immenouncement last night.

The reply will take the form of a French memorandum in which Great Britain has concurred. It will be communicated to the United States by both the French and British ambassadors at Washington. An identical memorandum will be sent to all other neutral countries.
