

Federal game regulations and Prices \$6, \$8, hunting restrictions in this territory have been changed so as to permit have been changed so as to permit an early spring season of thirty days for shorting ducks more and other for shooting ducks, geese and other waterfowl hereafter. Notice to this efect has just been received by Chief Game Warden Rutenbeck.

The old regulation made the closed season run from December 21 to September 5, inclusive, thus prohibiting any spring shooting whatever. Now the bars are let down to hunters from February 9 to March 10, inclusive. To offset this, one month and fifteen days are taken from the open season in the fall, which will run in future from September 16 to November 15, inclusive. It will be lawful
