

"For many years a member of the member of the national executive committee of the progressive party, I wish heartily to congratulate you on the passage of the Keating Child labor

"Your splendid attitude on this question and willingness to change from your former position with the state-rights democrats to federal or nation control when it becomes clearly ficient proof of wavering progressives that the democratic party is as willing as the republican party, in proper cases, to put the national welfare above state considerations.

"As an ardent advocate of a national equal suffrage amendment, I am convinced that the majority of the democratic congressmen will eventually favor such a measure as they now have passed a national child labor
