C., Aug. 13.—President Wilson, deeply concerned over the possibility that a general strike may tie up the country's railroads, is prepared to make an insistent personal appeal for an amicable settlement when the representatives of the roads and their employes confer with im tomorrow at the White House.

Since the situation became threatening the president has been in close touch with developments and has used rovernment to bring the two factions together. He has taken no stand on the merits of the controversy, however, and it is not expected that he will do so at the conference tomorrow, but will emphasize the far-reaching effect a strike would have on the
