The state canvassing board met yesterday at the secretary of state's office, as required by law, and officially signed the certificates attesting the tabulation of the official vote.

Certificates of election will be issued by Governor Morehead and Secretary of State Pool to the successful candidates for supreme and district court judges and for university regents. On all other state offices, as well as on presidential electors, the congressmen and United States senators, the legislature will canvass the vote and declare the results on January 3 or 4, after which certificates of election will be issued by the governor and secretary of state.

Members of the legislature will receive their election certificates from county clerks in their respective districts.
