





Feb. 4.-It cas reported tonight in diplomatic unrters, but unconfirmed in any American official source that President Wilson in advising neutrals of action in severing diplomatic remone with Germany has invited ther neutrals to follow his course. President Wilson's address to congress today said he would expect steps to American rights.

Officials tonight did not make clear hether the president expected the neutrals to follow his example in the steps already taken or whether he expected them to follow the steps of the United States would take in the mest eventuality. Some of the officials who were asked o explain the uncertainty declined to inclined to believe that the president hoped other neutrals would, by severing diplomatic relations, make a combined protest with thte United States against the latest war zone demee. The effect of a united neutral protest, some officials hoped, would have the effect of modifying Germany's announced intentions.


