# **CALL ASSESSORS TOGETHER**



### **MAYOR OF TREYNOR** AND ARMED POSSE CAPTMRES ROBBERS


Omaha, Neb., March 21.-Quite an exciting man hunt near Treynor, in which a score of farmers, headed by Mayor Max Meyer of Treyfarm hands who are charged with robbing a farm house during the absence of the family.

The men, guarded by the posse, were brought to Council Bluffs last night and lodged in the county jail. One of them, George Mikesell, employed on the Jim Harbor farm, admitted breaking into the house and stealing clothing and jewelry. The other man said his name was Harry

Discovery of the robbery was made oon after it occurred. A posse was quickly organized. Mayor Meyer, in an automobile, spied the fugitives cutting across a field and they were surrounded. Mikesell was armed with a revolver, while Jones carried a rifle. Jones dropped to his knees and showed fight, but was awed into submission by the small army of farmers, who were armed with guns, clubs and pitchforks.

Sheriffff Groneweg this morning found that Mikesell had been indicted early in 1916 on a charge of stealing an automobile at Walnut, Ia. Mikesell eluded arrest and enlisted in the army. After serving for several months, he deserted, was captured and served time in the military prison
