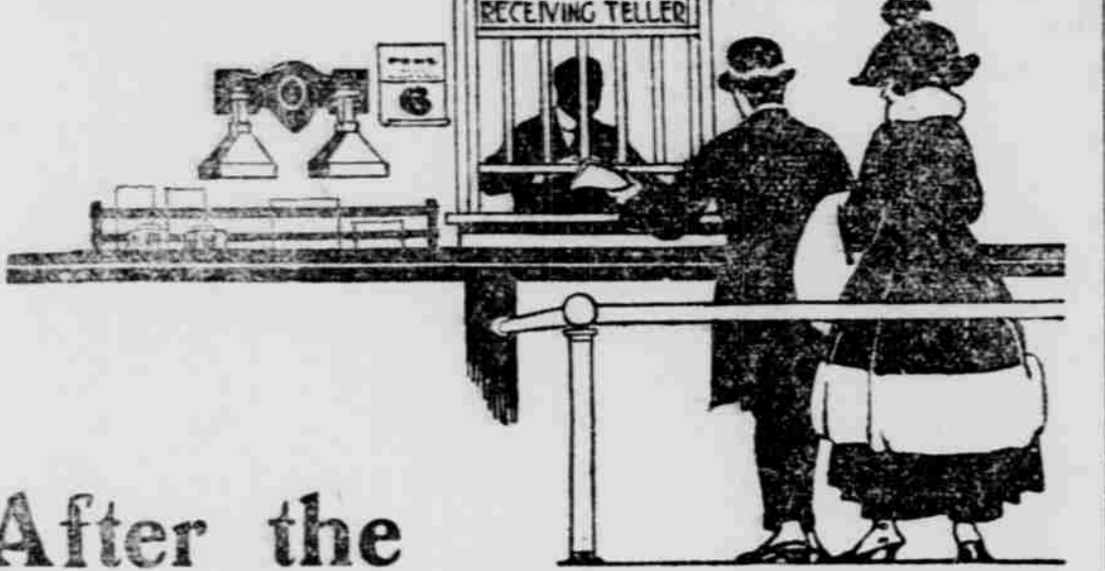

IN PLATTSMOUTH FORTY YEARS AGO.

We republish part of our stock feeding notes and add many names, which we have gathered from a trip through the county, made by Mr. Pettie in company with Mr. H. K. Smith of Bensley, Wagner & Bensley, a Chicago stock firm doing a large commission business in cattle, hogs, grain, etc.

This list is not completed, it is not absolutely correct, but is the best we have had yet to get at the value and amount of this business, and presents valuable statistics for future use.

We still hope to get some more as the northwestern part of the county has not been traveled over at all yet. Mr. Smith, who ought to be a judge, says these cattle will average 1,300 pounds, and at \$60 per head, which is a very low average, the enormous sum of \$506,000 is invested in the business, there being about 5,000 head, we can now count up in the county.

About two hogs run to every steer, so we can form some estimate of the hog crop. Now, friends, farmers, don't grow or sell if every figure here is not right, you should send in your own statistics and then they would be sure to be right—we do the best we can and give us credit for what we do well, and not for all the mistakes.
