The Missouri river at this point seems to have reached the height of the flood stage and this morning had fallen several inches from the record of the previous day. The bottom land east of the depot still has a large amount of the flood water standing on it, and it will require several days for this to subside to any great extent as long as the river remains as high as it has been for the last few ays. The high water has done but ittle damage at this point, but farther up the river, seems to have been the cause of rendering several honfred residents of the lowlands east of Omaha temporarily homeless, and also, on the east side of the river, hetween Council Bluffs and Folsom, In., has flooded the low lands to a great extent. The raise in the river here as well as the backing up of the sewer creek has caused the bottom road to be rather difficult to travel. owing to the fact that the water at several points has overflowed into the readway and cut out the use of the road for a few days by automoiles. 
