Large numbers of Germans had been taken prisoner-more than 12,and machine guns and great quantities of ammunition and other war stores were in American hands.

Close Mouth of Sack.

From Haitonville, on the north across the salient castward to Pagny of the big sack that extended southward to St. Mihiel, trapping within t by their fast advance all the enemy forces who failed to take refuge in flight when the great bombardment of Thursday morning heralded the approach of the offensive.

In addition, along the eastern side of the heights north of Hattonville the Americans have debouched from the hill region and are astride the railroad running from Commercy to Verdun. Likewise the Thiaucourt-Metz and Nancy-Metz railroads are in American hands.

Beginning in the northwest and crossing the salient eastward, Fresnes, Les Eparges, Hattonville, Preny and Pagny and all the ground lying between them are in American hands. The towns of Vignenlles, Thiaucourt, Pont-a-Mousson and St. present line. Mont Sec, the dominating height in the center of the salient, and from which much trouble had been expected, fell without fighting. 
