DEATH OF JOHN E. BAKER

John E. Baker who died Friday morning of influenza at his home on the Serle Davis farm northeast of town was buried in Oakwood cemetery at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon. On account of the illness of Mrs. Baker and a child and the prevailing epidemic only short services were held at the grave conducted by the Rev. W. H. Riley, pastor of the Congregational church.

Mr. Baker had lived in the community the last five years, coming here from Missouri. He held a reputation as a splendid worker and an honest and upright man. He was 34 years, 6 months and 29 days old. He leaves to mourn his untimely death

besides his wife and five children his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Baker, four miles southeast of town, six brother and two sisters; the brother, Joe and sister Bertha who live with their parents, two brothers, Ernest and Ed of Dewey, Okla., 1. J., two miles west of town, Theodore, of Kansas City, Archie of Missouri and a married sister of Manhattan, Kas. The two latter were unable to get here for the funeral.—Weeping Water Republican.
