MAKES TELLING SPEECH IN CAMPAIGN

CARLTON CHAMBERLAYNE OF SCHENECTADY, N. Y., HEARD AT COURT HOUSE

From Wednesday's Daily. The meeting last evening at the district court room which was the opening campaign speech of either party in this city, was very poorly attended, although those who were present were deeply and thoughtfully studying the telling points made by Mr. Carlton Chamberlayne of Schenectady, New York, who was the principal speaker of the evening.

Following Mr. Moran, the principal speaker occupied something over an hour in a very pleasing informal address that in its simplicity was clear-cut facts made itself felt by the audience. Mr. Chamberlayne reviewed a number of the great constructive measures that the democratic party has written in the laws of the land and which have brought the nation forward on the way of progress and the betterment of the people of the nation...

On the league of nations the speaker declared that there had been no issue so misrepresented in the history of the nation and it had been made so by reason of petty party politics, that the republicans who had earnestly supported the proposition had yielded their position on the demand of the chairman of the republican national committee...

On the six votes for England which has been one of the rallying cries of the senatorial league, the speaker stated that the league was composed of two bodies—the council and the assembly and that in the council the nations all had one vote, France, the United States, England, Japan, Italy and Belgium all being members of this body, and this council was the final governing body of the league...

The question of section ten was then discussed and the speaker pointed out that the section did not give any more reason for sending troops abroad that would exist in any state of war. The constitution of the United States was the only power in the nation that could make war or allow the sending of troops abroad...

PLAN OF PACKERS FLATLY REJECTED

Government Takes Stand That New Means for Control of Livestock Trade Are Provided.

Washington, Sept. 28.—The plan of the "big five" Chicago meat packers for disposition of their stockyard interests was rejected by the government today on the grounds that it provided new means by which the buying and selling of livestock could be restrained and controlled.

The objections of the department of justice followed the lines of a recent report by the federal trade commission, which held that the proposed holding corporation would enable employment of monopolistic practices.

The government laid before the court an alternative plan and officials declined to predict the outcome that would be followed should the court sustain the government.
