He was first appointed to this position in 1908 by his father, Judge H. D. Travis and has served during his terms of office as well as seven years with Judge James T. Begley. Swab was called and it was found that one of the small shot had penetrated just below the eyeball and inflicted a very painful injury although it is thought that the eye will not sustain any serious damage as the result of the shot.
