DOING IMPROVING

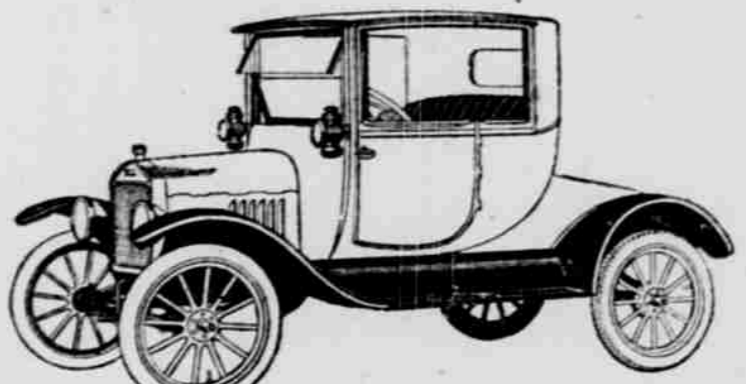
