

GOVERNMENT REPORT SHOWS AN INCREASE IN SHEEP

Number in Nebraska Shows Increase Over Last Year—Marketing is Brisk Over the Country.

Nebraska had 697,000 lambs and sheep on feed last year as compared to 762,000 head December 1 and 556,000 head a year ago, according to estimates released today by A. E. Anderson of the division of crop and live stock estimates.

The two principal feeding areas of the country are the corn belt states and the western irrigated region.

A total of 145,000 fat sheep and lambs were marketed from Nebraska during December as compared to 121,000 a year ago.

Altho present estimates indicate a large increase over January 1, 1922, attention is directed to the fact that sheep and lamb feeding was on a much restricted scale a year ago.
