REACHES LOWEST POINT OF ALL TIME

French and Belgian Money Crashes Downward as Sterling Holds Firm on N. Y. Market.

New York, Aug. 9 .- French and Belgian francs were quoted at their lowest rates for all time in today's foreign exchange market in direct reflection of Germany's announced intention to continue passive resistance in the Ruhr.

French francs sold as low as 5.65 ents each, or four points below last night's final rate, while Belgian francs dropped 20 points to 4.23 cents and rallied later to 4.27 cents. Sterling exchange held firm.
