Lincoln, Sept. 13 .- Governor Bry-

"Magnificent as our constitution is, unparalleled as has been its prosperity thereunder, and successful as has been its general prosperity, still there are those who would destroy it," the proclamation states.

"Therefor . . . to re-establish the Constitution of the United States and the principles and ideas of our government in the minds and hearts of our people, I . . . urge that all educational agencies endeavor to tell, during the week, something of the story and value of the constitution and that every citizen during the week may read and discuss the constitution and that everyone to whom these times seem trublous and full of vivid fears should engrave upon his memory and think often of these words." The proclamation then quotes th preamble of the Constitution.
