The following is a very timely address by C. W. Watson, secretary of the Federation of Nebraska Retailers, of Lincoln, which was given to the residents of the middle west Monday evening over the radio station KFMX, Hastings.

The function of business is threefold:—First, to provide for the material needs of mankind; second, to increase the wealth of the world; and third, to enhance the value and happiness of life.

The continuity of the success of any business concern is dependent upon the continuity of its opportunity to serve. Granting the continuity of opportunity of service, the permanency of the success of any business concern is measured by the permanency with which it is actuated with a desire to grasp this opportunity of service.

The second purpose finds expression in such association activities as the following: First, the promotion of a spirit of good fellowship and friendship among members, that each day may, by such contact, be elevated to a higher plane of useful endeavor in his chosen line; second, the educating and training of the inexperienced and unsuccessful in a given line, that the level of efficiency in that line may be raised and a service of equal or greater worth thereby rendered to the public at a cost lower than could otherwise be possible; third, the promotion of vocational research and training, through co-operation with schools, colleges and universities, that the business men and women of the next generation may enter the field better qualified and with a loftier and more exalted opinion of its opportunity for usefulness.

These results are but tangible evidence of what can be accomplished through co-operation of persons associating themselves for the common good.
