A good New Year's ceive these tags, this license to oper- resolution is to drive more carefully ate their cars on the public streets and highways, will use every precaution to avoid accidents, that they will comply with the state, city and county laws pertaining to the operation of motor vehicles, and, at the same time, providing for the safety of pedestrians and of others who are entitled to lawful use of streets and public roads. Nevertheless, there are thousands of those who receive these tags, and display them on their cars, or trucks, who seem to think that the license gives them the liberty to do what they please in the matter of operating their cars. It does nothing of the sort. It imposes second, to be reasonable; third, to be courteous, always.

These are not stringent observances that the state exacts in return for the use of the streets and highways, by means of automobiles and trucks. The license tag is issued in good faith. In too many instances it is accepted and used in a manner to indicate that the user can do what he, or she, pleases, can injure other persons more or less seriously or even kill them, if so they are pleased to do, and as is being done every day, everywhere.
