GRAVELING LOOKS GOOD FOR EARLY COMMENCEMENT

State Department of Public Works Will Open Bids On May 29th For Graveling Highway.

From Wednesday's Dally-

The early start of the work of graveling the King of Trails highway from this city south to the Otoc county line, looks very good now, as the state department of public works is calling for bids to be opened on Thursday, May 29th.

The amount of graveling that will e required will be 197,700 square ards of graveling surfacing three

This project known as Nebruska hty-Plattsmouth project No. 28, 1 one of the most important that the state department has before it this unimer and will complete a large stretch on the plan of a hard suraced road through the state from orth to south. This highway has for several years

een a federal and state aid project and has been graded and maintained in keeping with the federal requirements for a road of this class. The grading has been arranged so as to comply with all the requirements of the federal government and will be ill ready to receive the surfacing of gravel as soon as the contract is let and the material can be placed on he ground.

The graveling of the road will ive Otoe and Cass counties a good, ard-surfaced highway through the wo counties and on the south Nenaha and Richardson counties will be expected to get in line and join in making the road completely graveled to the Kansas-Nebraska line. The project from Omaha south to

his city will also be pushed as rapidly as possible to get it in shape by fall or early next spring so that the lighway will be one of the best in he state and make possible practically a thorough hard-surfaced road from Kansas to Omaha. From the Nebraska metropolis the King of Trails highway will run north to the anadian line and it is the desire to ave this all hard-surfaced in time.

The nearness of the graveling ere brings up the question of the graveling of "no man's land," or otherwise the strip of road from the Chicago avenue paving to the vicinity of the C. E. Cook place where the county gravel will stop. This piece of road must be graveled in the very near future and how this is to be carried out is a problem that the lattsmouth citizens should com

MANY SEE TC-6 DEFLATED IN OR-DER TO SAVE IT

Plattsmouth Visitors See Dirigible at Fort Crook Deflated in Face of Heavy Wind Storm.

and vicinity motored to Fort Crook yesterday to look over the TC-6, the army dirigible that arrived at the army post Saturday from St. Joseph, Missouri, and which it had been intended was to have been taken to Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, this

The visitors at Fort Crook yester-day were treated to the unusual feature of the battle of the soldiers and civilian employes to save the blimp from destruction in the face of the heavy wind storm that swept over this part of Nebraska.

The storm increased in such violence that emergency measures to save the airship was necessary, as it was threatening to break away from its anchors and sweep away to probable destruction in the storm. Col John Pagelow, commander of the craft pulled the rip cord of the ship's bag allowing the helium gas to es-

A high west wind made necessary the action after volunteers, in addition to the regular aides at Fort Crook, were unable to hold the ship

The bag and gondola will be shipped to the home hangar, Scott field, Belleville, Ill., the colonel said tonight. The TC-6 arrived here yesterday from St. Joseph and flew over Omaha this morning at 7:30. Difficulty was experienced in landing and the wind increased in velocity as the day went on.
