County Clerk of Cass county, Nebraska, and certificate of registration be endorsed upon said bonds, thereupon said bonds shall be delivered to the purchaser thereof upon receipt of the purchase price, being not less than par value.

Section 7.—That a levy shall be made as provided by law to provide a sinking fund for taking up and paying off said bonds as they become due and payable and for paying the interest thereon when due.

Section 8.—That for the payment of said bonds, both principal and interest, the full faith and credit of said Louisville precinct, and its property, revenues and resources are hereby irrevocably pledged.

Approved and adopted this 7th day of May, A. D. 1925. FRED H. GORDER, Chairman of the Board of Co. Commissioners.

It was moved by Spangler and seconded by Harris that the above and foregoing resolution providing for the issuance of bonds of Louisville precinct in the sum of \$28,000.00 be adopted as read. The vote being as follows: Fred H. Gorder, aye; C. F. Harris, aye; C. D. Spangler, aye.

"Shall the Board of County Commissioners of Cass county, Nebraska, make a special levy, not to exceed two (2) mills upon all the property in said Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, tax to be levied for one year only upon the property in said Road District No. 14, the same to be used for improving the public highways by grading, draining and graveling the same, to-wit:

"Beginning at the south line of the City of Weeping Water, Nebraska, between Sections one (1) and two (2), thence continuing south between Sections 13 and 14, Sections 23 and 24, to connect with the O street road. All of the above roads are in Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska."

The vote shall be by ballot and be prepared by the County Clerk of said county to be used for the submission of said proposition at said election, and be prepared on white paper of sufficient dimensions with at least one inch margin on each side of the ballot and shall be printed in substantially the following form:

Whereas, at a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Cass county, Nebraska, held at its regular place of meeting, at the court house in Plattsmouth in said county, on the 7th day of May, A. D. 1925, a petition signed by more than ten freeholders of Road District No. 14, in Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska, was presented to said Board, requesting the said Board of County Commissioners to give due notice and call a special election of the qualified voters of said Road District No. 14 in Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska, to be held on Tuesday, the 9th day of June, A. D. 1925, at the hour of eight o'clock a. m. until the hour of eight o'clock p. m., on said date, at which election there shall be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of said Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, and be by them voted upon the following proposition, to-wit:

"Beginning at the south line of the City of Weeping Water, Nebraska, between Sections one (1) and two (2), thence continuing south between Sections 13 and 14, Sections 23 and 24, to connect with the O street road. All of the above roads are in Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska. And—Whereas, said Board of County Commissioners finds that said petition for the improving of highways, as described thereon, was signed by more than ten freeholders of said precinct as provided by law, and as shown by the certificate of Register of Deeds;

Therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Chairman and Board of County Commissioners of Cass county, Nebraska, that a special election of Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct in the County of Cass and State of Nebraska shall be held in the school house of District No. 83, within said Road District No. 14, on Tuesday, the 9th day of June, A. D. 1925, at the hour of eight o'clock a. m. until the hour of eight o'clock p. m., on said date, at which election there shall be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of said Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, and be by them voted upon the following proposition, to-wit:

Should two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast by the legal voters of said Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska, at said special election upon the foregoing proposition, having a cross (X) mark in the square following the word "YES," then the foregoing proposition to make a special levy not to exceed two (2) mills upon all the property in Road District No. 14, tax to be levied for one year only upon the property in said Road District No. 14, Weeping Water precinct, Cass county, Nebraska, for improving the public highways by grading, draining and graveling the same, shall be declared carried and duly adopted. Said special election is to be called pursuant to Section 2634 of the Compiled Statutes of Nebraska, 1922, and amendments thereto.

ALLEGED NEBRASKA BANK BANDITS ARE CAPTURED AT COLBY

Men Taken After Robbery in Kansas Identified by Bethany and Cortland Bankers.

Lincoln, Neb., May 15.—A telegram received this evening from Sheriff Condit at Colby, Kan., said he had identified the two men held there following their alleged robbery of the bank at Kanorado and their subsequent capture, as the two who participated in a number of bank holdups in Nebraska. According to State Sheriff Condit, the men are Ray Brennan of Bethune, Colo., and Jack Brown, giving his address as Kansas City, but a former resident of Uehling, Neb.

PROHIBITION OFFICER KILLS JEFFERSON MAN

Elk Point, S. D., May 15.—Francis Fountain, 22, of Jefferson, S. D., was shot and killed today by Ike McCoun, federal prohibition officer from Sioux Falls. McCoun said the young man attacked him from behind in an encounter near Jefferson.

Both men, according to the state sheriff, had a part in the robberies of the banks at Bethany and Cortland, Neb. Brown alone, he says, looted the bank at Princeton, Neb. Other robberies in this state are credited to them. Sheriff Condit left yesterday for Colby after learning of the capture of the men by posses from western Kansas and eastern Colorado. He took with him two bankers, one from Bethany and one from Cortland, who had been held up at the time of the robbery of their respective banks, and the two reports were positive in their identification.

An extra guard was thrown around the jail following receipt of reports here that farmers from around Jefferson had threatened to raid it.
