Wheeling Panic **Continues After** John D. Sells

"Corner" Not Broken, But Big Merger May Result From Coup .-Shorts Drop Millions.

New York, Feb. 8 .- Revelation that John D. Rockefeller had sold his interests in the Wheeling & Lake Erie railroad, and that the New York Central, Baltimore & Ohio and the Nickel Plate interests had bought them, failed to quiet the New York stock market today.

The fact that the Wheeling & Lake Erie corner has not yet been broken and knowledge of the forces behind the recent flurries in small railroad stocks on the market served to maintain the excitement.
