Democrats are Planning to Start 1928 Campaign

Propose to Organize Nation-wide Rallies on Jefferson's Birthday -Seek Reconciliation.

Washington, March 22.—Democratic leaders are preparing to start the 1928 political campaign a full year ahead of time.

Leaving aside for the moment these questions which have led to division within the party, they are seeking to consolidate their lines up on the issue of "Jeffersonian democracy."

Both the democratic national committee and the democratic congressional campaign committee are sending letters to the party wheel-horses and titular party officials urging that the day be made one of nationwide reconsecration to the principles of the sage of Monticello.

"These meetings should be devoted to a teaching of democratic principles, and not to a discussion of candidates," says one of these letters.

Plattsmouth, Nebr., March 1st, 1927. Board met pursuant to adjournment. Present, C. F. Harris, C. D. Spangler and Fred H. Gorder, County Commissioners, and Geo. R. Sayles, County Clerk.

Minutes of last session read and approved, when the following business was transacted in regular form: Mothers Pension orders by County Judge renewing pensions for Mrs. Zella Conley, Esther Converse, Anna Ziska, Mary Piper, Marcia Hise and Mrs. Will Hindman, approved by the Board.

Official bond of E. A. Kirkpatrick, member of Soldiers' Relief Commission, approved.

Official bond of Henry Snell, assessor, Weeping Water City, approved by the County Judge and filed for recording.

Official bond of Julius A. Pitz, assessor for Plattsmouth City, approved by the County Judge and filed for recording.

Petition for sale of real estate, Lots 5 and 6, in Block 20, Village of Murdock, owned by Angelo Antonio Nuziati (insane) was signed and granted.

Resolution

Before the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Cass, Nebraska. At a meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Cass, Nebraska, held this 1st day of March, 1927, there being present C. F. Harris, Chairman, and C. D. Spangler and Fred H. Gorder, the following resolution was presented to the Board:

"Whereas, by resolution heretofore made this date accepting \$20,000.00 as full liability of the General Casualty & Surety Company, of Detroit, Michigan, as surety on the Depository bond of the First National Bank, of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and assigning any right of the County of Cass, Nebraska, as to said \$20,000.00 in claim against the First National Bank of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, or Fred Buerstetta, Receiver thereof, and

"Whereas, in a suit now pending in the District Court of Cass County, Nebraska, entitled Mia U. Gering, County Treasurer of the County of Cass, Nebraska, v. Fred Buerstetta, Receiver of the First National Bank of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, the County of Cass, Nebraska, and others, defendants, the said County of Cass, Nebraska, has filed its answer and cross petition praying, among other things for judgment against the defendant First National Bank as principal, and General Casualty & Surety Company as surety, for the sum of \$20,000.00, interest and costs, or in the alternative for judgment therefor against the plaintiff and her bondsmen and the defendant First National Bank of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, its officers and directors for the sum of \$30,882.19 with interest and costs of suit; and

"Whereas, the plaintiff Mia U. Gering, as County Treasurer of the County of Cass, Nebraska, in her said suit, prays judgment against the First National Bank of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, for the sum of \$20,000.00 as a preferred claim against the assets of the First National Bank, of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, and

"Whereas, Be It Resolved, that the cross petition of the County of Cass, Nebraska, as to judgment for said \$20,000.00 with interest, be dismissed and that said petition for alternative judgment for the sum of \$30,882.19 with interest, be reduced upon the receipt of said \$20,000.00 to the sum of \$10,882.19 with interest; and that the plaintiff as County Treasurer aforesaid, be relieved of any liability for the sum of \$20,000.00, and that said plaintiff be authorized to reduce her prayer for judgment to \$10,882.19 with interest.

"Be it further Resolved, that the said plaintiff, Mia U. Gering, as County Treasurer of the County of Cass, Nebraska, be and she is hereby authorized to file the necessary proof of claim with the Receiver of the First National Bank, of Plattsmouth, Nebraska, for said \$20,000.00, and is hereby authorized and directed to assign the receiver's certificate for said amount to the General Casualty & Surety Company, of Detroit, Michigan.

"Nothing herein contained to be construed as a waiver of the claim of the County of Cass, Nebraska, for judgment for the sum of \$10,882.19, with interest, as a trust fund, or in the alternative for judgment for said sum of \$10,882.19 as against the defendants as prayed for in said cross petition of the County of Cass, Nebraska."

On motion of Fred H. Gorder, seconded by Chas. D. Spangler, that the above Resolution be adopted— Said Resolution was passed with the following vote: C. F. Harris, aye; C. D. Spangler, aye; Fred H. Gorder, aye.—Attest—

Gravel Project in West Part of County Boosted

From Monday's Daily—Residents There Want Hard Surfaced North and South Highway Connecting D. L. D. and O St.

Last night about a hundred men from Eagle and Greenwood, and those living along the road west of Eagle between the two towns, met at the King school house to discuss the proposition of graveling the road from O street north to Greenwood, a road, connecting the D. L. D. and Harding highways.

Will Althouse was acting chairman of the meeting and Commissioner or Fred Gorder the principal speaker, enumerating the various ways in which the proposition could be gotten at.

The defeat of the additional one cent gas tax bill made it impossible for the county to do any such work, and the State and Federal aid would not be available because this road is not included in the system of highways adopted but not completed.

The only method available would be a bond issue, either by petition of 51 per cent of the acreage for two miles on each side of the proposed district, or by an election in the two precincts affected.

After considerable discussion of the project, the meeting adjourned without action of any kind on the matter.—Eagle Beacon.
