Motor Vehicles Take Heavy Toll of Life in Nation

One Person Killed by Each 1,000 Motor Vehicles in the Country, Figures Denote

As nearly as I have been able to ascertain from available statistics, the 22,000,000 motor vehicles in the United States last year were responsible for the deaths of 23,000 persons—one death for each 1,000 vehicles.

Furthermore, during the last five years 100,000 deaths and 3,500,000 injuries are directly traceable to motor vehicles, these casualties equaling in number the entire population of Missouri or California; exceeding by a good half million the combined United States troops in the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, the war with Mexico, the Civil War and the war with Spain; exceeding by more than 3,000,000 the total casualties of United States soldiers in the World War.

A total 23,000 persons killed by automobiles in 1926—about equal the population of Greenville, S. C. This is more than four times as many as were killed by all the steam railroads of the country that ran passenger and freight trains as many as 1,184,000,000 miles, carried nearly a billion passengers and nearly two and a half billions tons of freight.

It is more than 10 times as many as were killed by all the street railways of the country that operated passenger cars a total distance of nearly two billion miles and carried fourteen billion passengers.

How are we going to stop this terrific slaughter? For stop it we must if we would preserve our America in its present form. Rome went to pieces for less.

All previous methods of reducing the toll have failed. Safety councils have put forth noble efforts, but the task is too big. The whole country needs to mobilize—all of its man power, all of its resources, if necessary—and go after the relatively small but nevertheless deadly army of reckless and incompetent drivers responsible for such wholesale murder and the maiming of our citizens.

Go after this foe as wholeheartedly, as vigorously, and with as much blood in our eyes as we went after England, Mexico, Spain or Germany, and I predict that these killings will stop within six weeks. And why shouldn't we take this step—declare war on reckless drivers?—and I don't mean this figuratively. Two or three thousand lives a year? Isn't it worth it? Surely this is as great an issue as that leading to the war with England in 1775, or to the war of 1812. At least England hadn't taken the lives of any of our citizens.

Certainly war was entered into with Mexico with less involved. It took but the order of 250 sailors of the battleship Maine to plunge us into war with Spain, but the drowning of 1,150 passengers on the Lusitania to precipitate us into the greatest war of all times.

The way is clear—the elimination of the reckless driver is the sacred and pre-eminent duty of America. Hundreds of these ruthless rippers can be plainly seen on the streets of every city in the land, driving with little regard for anybody or anything save for the diabolical and senseless thrill of covering space as rapidly as gasoline, machinery and rubber will allow. Pick them off now from our public travel and remove from them their engines of destruction. Weed them out. Punish them. Put them in stocks in the very center of our cities where everybody can gaze upon the degrading countenances of typical, natural-born killers, devoid of every vestige of the right to associate with and live among human beings.

To accomplish our task, firm and drastic measures are essential. We will need alert armed guards on fleet motorcycles to patrol the streets and highways with authority and orders to arrest every violator of the fundamental principles of safety. We must have courts to handle these cases promptly and impartially. The fine system should be tabooed. Fines might act as a deterrent to the poor, but they mean nothing to the rich. Nothing short of good, stiff jail sentences of other severe punishment is going to make our streets safe.

For self-preservation, then, if for no other reason, let us declare war on and eliminate the reckless driver. W. F. Long in "Nations Traffic."
