#### SENATOR NORRIS WORIES ABOUT NICARAGUA

The authority of the president to interfere in the affairs of another country and to supervise the elections, has been a subject of discussion for some time. This last occasion was the interference in Nicaragua when we sent a large force of marines to protect lives and property of our own and foreign citizens from assaults and depredations from armed bands of rebels seeking to overthrow the regular government of President Diaz. Later on arrangements were affected between Diaz and those opposing him through which we were to supervise the next national election announced for this year. All came into this but Sandino. who continued his fight against Diaz and our marines. Now Senator Norris of Nebraska, selecting another pin, inserted into the adminstration. This was in the form of a resolution for a senate inquiry into the power of the president to supervise elections abroad and at home.
